- Q1. Will you confirm for us that the only acceptable varieties on this solicitation are Valencia, Pineapple, and Hamlin?
- A1. Correct. Only the Valencia, Pineapple, and Hamlin varieties will be accepted, which differs from the Commodity Specifications for Fresh Citrus. This is listed in the tendering text of the solicitation.
- Q2. Will you confirm that on this solicitation, that Trade Mitigation Desk Audit Letters are acceptable as well as USDA GAP/GHP audits?
- A2. Yes. For this solicitation only, Trade Mitigation Desk Audit Letters will be accepted as well as listing a Desk Audited supplier on the Verification Document. Please contact scaudits@usda.gov for more information on desk audits.
- Q3. Are the Global GAP, Primus, or other GFSI benchmarked audits acceptable for this purchase?
- A3. No. The forms of acceptance for this purchase are USDA GAP/GHP Audits or Desk Audit Letters issued by USDA only. The GFSI audits in order to obtain a desk audit are listed in the tendering text of the solicitation. Please note that all required documentation must be submitted to Specialty Crops Audit Services at least 5 days prior to bid due date to ensure enough time to complete the audits. Offerors that do not abide by this may be deemed non-responsive.
- Q4. If an offeror received a bench audit acceptance from the prior citrus bid can they attach the certificates to the new bid or do you need all the documentation that we originally uploaded?
- A4. All required documentation listed in each respective solicitation is needed. There is no acceptance based on approval from previous solicitations. Offerors must either complete and upload the USDA Verification Document with current and approved GAP/GHP audited suppliers or a Desk Audit Letter. Please note that Desk Audits are only valid through the date listed near each ranch/packinghouse. Desk Audit Letters with expired dates will not be accepted. USDA GAP/GHP audit are valid one year from the time of issue.
- Q5. As stated in the solicitation: "Inspection and certification of fresh citrus for this solicitation must be performed after final packaging and prior to shipping. The fresh citrus will be Positive Lot Identified by the Federal or Federal-State Inspection Service." What are adequate shipping points for inspection?
- A5. Per our audit requirements specified, all packinghouses, shipping points, et cetera, handling, packing, and shipping fresh fruit must be approved at the time of bid due date. Please note that the contractor must give the inspection service 72 hours advanced notice when scheduling inspection. - Q6. Per the FAR, is the affirmative action clause applicable before or after award?
- A6. The Master Solicitation contains the provision at 52.222-22 Previous Contracts and Compliance Reports (Feb 1999). Vendors must provide a response to this provision with their bid.
- Q7. If an expiration date listed on a desk audit for the GFSI benchmarked facility is in the middle of a delivery period of the solicitation, can the offeror still participate?
- A7. The expiration dates of the Desk Audits must expire after the bid opening date. Desk audits with expiration dates listed before the bid opening will not be accepted. USDA GAP/GHP audits are valid one year from date issued.

- Q9. In the event of extreme weather, will there be delivery extensions?
- A9. Please refer to 52.212-4 (f) Excusable Delays for guidance in the Master Solicitation.
- Q10. Does each load need to be inspected even if the warehouse has the correct audits and in-house inspectors?
- A10. Each load needs to be inspected and issued a certificate. The contractor is responsible for the cost of the required inspections.
- Q11. If an offeror is submitting a bid, do they need to bid on every line item?
- A11. No. Offerors should only bid on what they can reasonably deliver. Offerors may enter constraints to indicate their maximum capacity per delivery period.
- Q12. For shipping point inspections, who issues certificates? Are state inspectors, in-house inspectors, or Partners in Quality managers able to fill out these forms?
- A12. State agencies control shipping point inspections and issue certificates to meet USDA requirements.
