# Highlights of Changes in Federal Order 7: the Consolidated Southeast Order

Consolidation (§1007.2) - The expanded Southeast Order includes all of Arkansas, 44 counties in southern Missouri, and 22 counties in Kentucky.

Prices for skim milk and butterfat (§1000.50) - Under the new Southeast Order, skim milk and butterfat are priced separately. The skim milk price is a price for milk with 0% butterfat; the butterfat price is the full price of a pound of butterfat.

#### Class I - fluid milk products, now including eggnog:

- Skim milk price is based on higher of formulas for powder or cheese, plus the Class I differential at plant location.
- Butterfat price is based on butter prices, plus the Class I differential at plant location.
- Announced by the 23<sup>rd</sup> of previous month (i.e., October price announced by September 23<sup>rd</sup>).
- Announced for Fulton County (Atlanta), Georgia: \$3.10 Glass I differential.

## Class II - soft manufactured dairy products and commercial food processing:

- Skim milk price announced by the 23<sup>rd</sup> of the previous month (i.e., October price announced by September 23<sup>rd</sup>).
- Skim milk price based on nonfat dry milk prices, plus 70¢ per hundredweight.
- Butterfat price announced by the 5<sup>th</sup> of the following month (i.e., October price announced by November 5<sup>th</sup>).
- Butterfat price based on butter prices (same as Class III butterfat price), plus 0.7¢ per pound.

#### Class III - most cheeses, including cream cheese:

- Butterfat price based on butter prices.
- Skim milk price based on cheese and whey prices, less the butterfat value in cheese.
- Announced by the 5<sup>th</sup> of the following month (i.e., October price announced by November 5<sup>th</sup>).

## Class IV - butter and all dry milk (including powder used to fortify Class !):

- Butterfat price based on butter prices (same as Class III butterfat price)
- Skim milk price based on nonfat dry milk prices.
- Announced by the 5<sup>th</sup> of the following month.
- Month-end inventories of bulk fluid milk and cream (including concentrate) are also added to Class IV.

Dumps, Animal Feed, Unavoidable Losses are assigned to the lowest priced class each month (usually III or IV).

Packaged Buttermilk Biscuit Mix is assigned to Class II if and only if food starch makes up more than 2% of total solids, and it is so labeled.

Location Adjustments for Class I milk, producer milk (§1000.52, §1007.51, §1007.75):

Equal to Class I differential at plant location minus \$3.10 (Class I differential at Atlanta). See table below.
