Marvin Frink

After graduating high school, Marvin Frink joined the military to provide for his family and to help serve his country. Dedicating 15 years of service, including deployment to fight for his country, Marvin found himself dealing with anxiety. His father noticed he was suffering with PTSD and introduced him to farming.

Using farming and working with the cattle on a daily basis helps with the transition from military life to civilian life. After the passing of his father, Marvin continued the dream his father had for him of becoming a cattleman.

Briarwood Cattle Farm is a first-generation cattle farm owned and operated by veteran Marvin Frink and his wife Tanisha Frink. After serving honorably in the U.S. Army, his father [the late Reverend Kirby Frink] saw that Marvin was suffering from PTSD and knew that farming and raising cattle would help. Living out his father's wishes, Marvin is now grazing a good healthy herd of Black Angus cattle in Red Springs, North Carolina.

In September 2024, a lifelong dream became a reality with the ground breaking for Marvin and Tanisha on the farm butcher shop. Briarwood Custom Meats Butcher Shop, LLC is a USDA inspected whole animal carcass cutting facility that will focus on sustainability and utilizing every part of the animal. Briarwood Custom Meats Butcher Shop is set to open mid November 2024. Marvin also created the Day of Healing for veterans, which for the last several years, has opened the farm to host speakers to shine a light on the importance of mental health, and to connect veterans with opportunities in agribusiness using Agritherapy.

Thankful for the opportunity to help feed America and become a better person with the outstanding support from family, close friends, and the community, success is in the near future for an American veteran who served his country proudly.

Retired U.S. Navy Chief Petty Officer, and currently serves as a Public Affairs Specialist with USDA Rural Development.

Mr. Douglas (Doug) Keeler completed 24 years as a Marine Corps Officer where he served as Commanding Officer during Operations Desert Storm and Desert Saber and led a humanitarian operation in Bangladesh during Operation Sea Angel, created the Marine Corps

Mortuary Affairs School and created the Marine Corps Logistics

Education Program, a graduate program at Penn State while serving as the career manager for senior logistics personnel. Upon his retirement from the Marine Corps, he returned to government service as the Marine Corps' Deputy for Life Cycle Management where he led the Marine Corps' signature process improvement project resulting in the creation of a governance structure over requirements, acquisition and sustainment and him being the first Chairman of the Total Life Cycle Management Corporate Board. He was also the Marine Corps' first Key Acquisition Leader representing Acquisition policy to the Under Secretary. He served as an Associate Deputy Administer (ADA) for Poultry Programs, Livestock Poultry and Seed and Science & Technology Program in the Agricultural Marketing Service. A leader in Veteran hiring, Doug was the first to use Operation Warfighter, Skillbridge and VA OJT programs in USDA where he was lauded for his 100% conversion rate from Veteran interns to FTEs. Additionally, Doug increased Veteran hires in AMS to over 25% in two fiscal years. He is currently the Deputy Director for the Office of Civil Rights Diversity and Inclusion in the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service. A graduate of the OMB Senior Executive Service Candidate Development Program, Doug has a master's degree in project management, is a Project Management Professional, a Lean Six-Sigma Green Belt and received his Logistics Professional Certificate from the Georgia Institute of Technology.
