#### 1. PURPOSE

This memorandum provides guidance on procedures for official sampling and gradingof bulk milled/brown rice for transloading between carriers.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

Purpose of this notice is to clarify official procedure options of milled/brown rice forcarrier-to-carrier transloading and ensure certificate information accuracy. The transferof such rice has a propensity to cause increased broken kernels that may affect the grade/quality of the lot. For example, an inspected lot of bulk milled/brown ricetransferred from trucks to a barge may no longer represent the grade/quality of the official truck lot certificate.

#### 3. POLICY

The guidance below provides official inspection procedures for bulk inspections in theevent the rice is later transferred to another carrier that most accurately reflects the grade/quality of rice on that carrier(s) at the time of inspection. In the event of atransfer, the identity of a lot for the final certificate will reflect the carrier(s) on which theoriginal inspection(s) were performed. If an applicant requires a final carrier certificate, the final carrier must be officially inspected (probed, Ellis cup, pelican, diverter sampler) if grade results are needed for the final carrier. Phytosanitary inspection results (FGIS-921-2) for the original inspection cannot be transferred to a subsequent carrier.

#### 4. PROCEDURES

Perform a lot inspection of the carriers (Round-Lot procedures may be utilized andgraded as single sublots or up to 4 composite sublots as described in the <a href="RiceHandbook">RiceHandbook</a>, "Round-Lot Inspection Plan"). A separate certificate must be issued foreach location. The applicant may request the transload activity be reflected byrequesting an approved applicant states statement using the final carrier information as a reference number that can be shown in the remarks section of the inspectioncertificate (This program notice is effective upon receipt.

Approved Applicant States Statement: "Applicant States: Reference Number – (final carrier ID)"

Note: A carrier type, ("Barge", "Container", etc.) cannot be indicated as part of the reference number.

Example: "Applicant States: Reference Number – ACG 123." NOT: "Applicant States: Reference Number – Barge ACG 123."

### 5. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following clarification/guidance will be placed in the Rice Questions and Answerssection on the AMS public website.

Can a Bulk Identity-Preserved Inspection Plan be provided for Milled/Brown Rice?

No. <u>FGIS-PN-02-01</u>, "<u>Bulk Identity-Preserved Inspection Plan</u>," is available for exportrough rice shipments only. Milled and Brown Rice have gone through a process(es) and have a greater potential for breakage through the transferring from one carrier toanother. This breakage can result in changes to the final grade/quality.

Can an official certificate be issued for a bulk milled/brown rice barge (or other carrier) that has not been officially sampled but that was observed being transferred from a previously sampled, inspected, and certified truck(s) (or other carrier(s))?

No. Per <u>7 CFR 868.36</u> "Loss of identity", once bulk milled/brown rice has been removed from the carrier it was inspected on, it is considered to have lost its identity from the original carrier(s) and must be inspected as a new lot. The original certificate(s) is/are no longer considered representative of the original lot(s). In order to meet the applicant's request, official personnel must sample, inspect, and grade the lot of rice after it has been loaded onto another carrier, in order to issue an official certificate that reflects the grade/quality of the rice on that carrier. Phytosanitary inspection may be performed upon request.

#### 6. FILING INSTRUCTIONS

File a copy of this memo with <u>Rice Handbook</u> until the handbook is revised to include this change. Field office managers must ensure that a copy of this memorandum is available to official agencies operating within their circuit.
