PRIVACY ACT AND PUBLIC BURDEN STATEMENTS

The following statements are made in accordance with the Privacy Act of 1974 (USC 552a) and the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995, as amended. NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT
