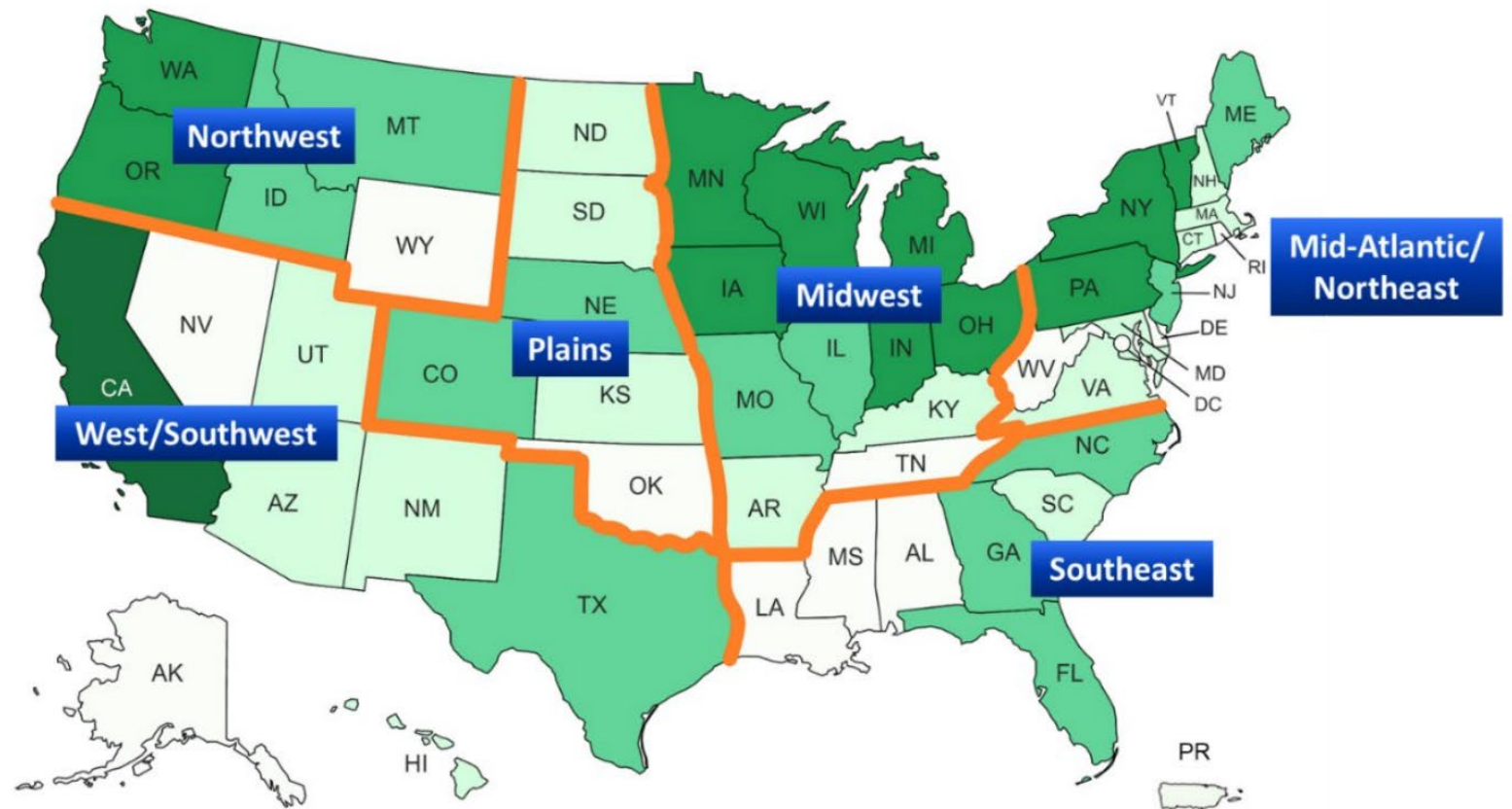

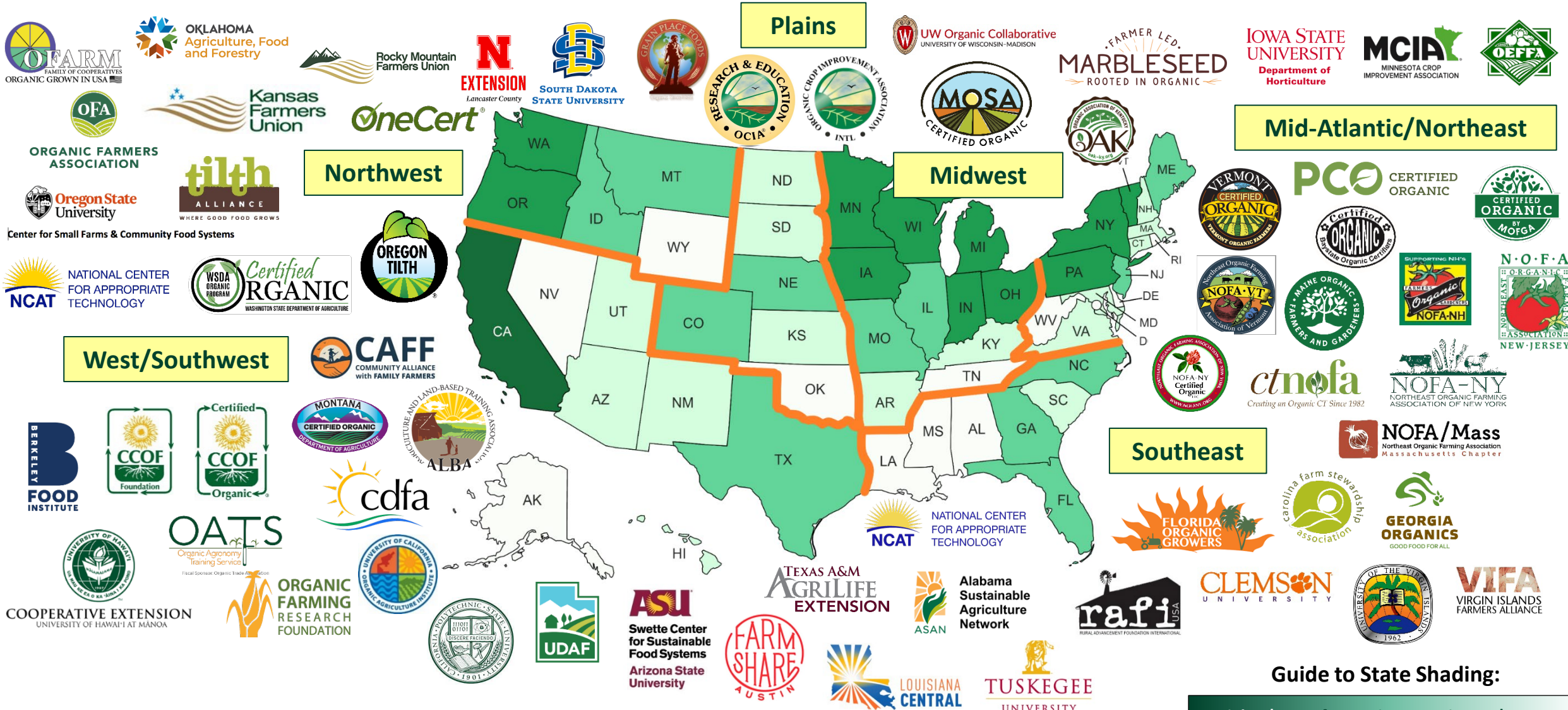




Organic Transition Initiative (OTI) Transition to Organic Partnership Program (TOPP) Regions

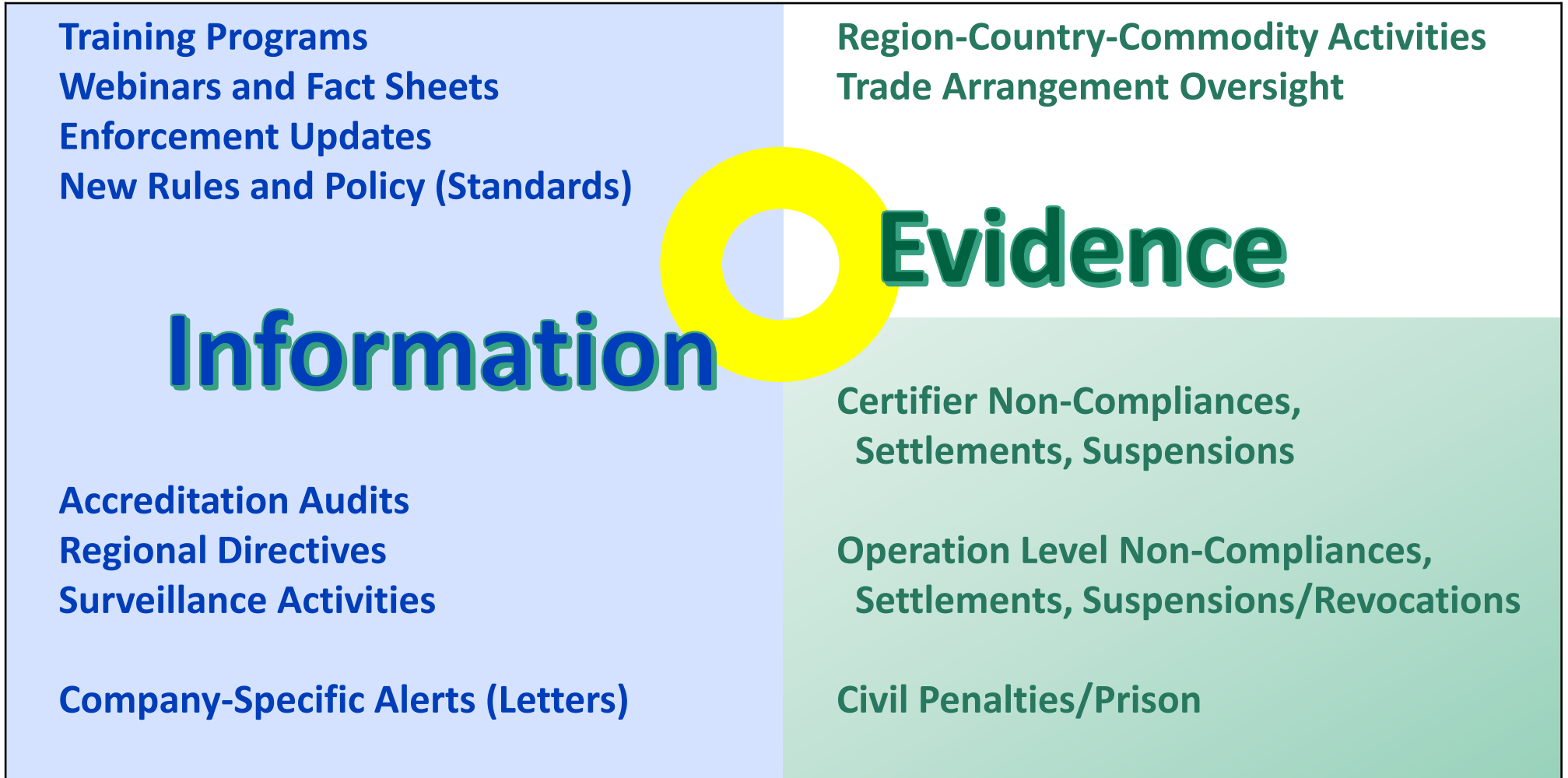

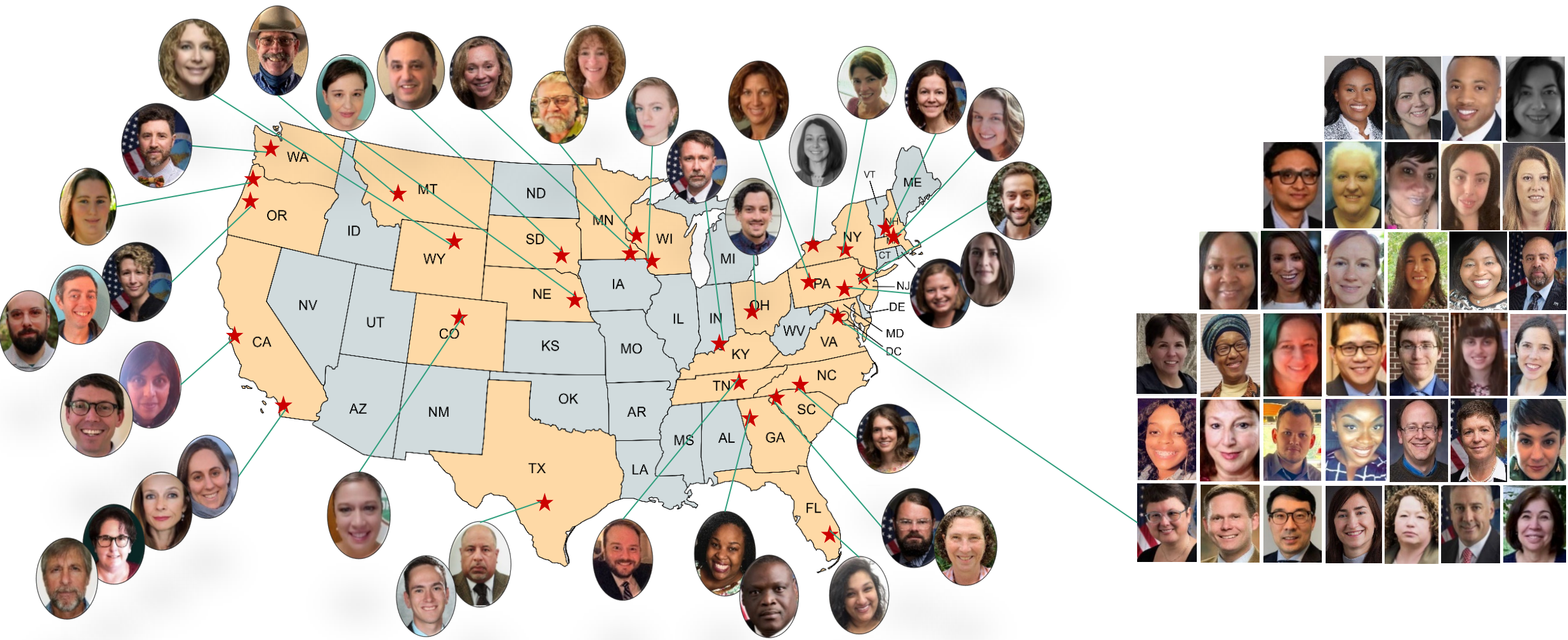
