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Background

Enabling Legislation: Livestock Mandatory Price Reporting Act of 1999, subsequent renewal legislation.

Congress intended for the SCL to aid in price discovery

SCL First published in August 2003



Who provides swine contract information?

- Approximately 83 packers and 61 plants
- Packers purchasing at least 200,000 and also slaughtered at least 200,000
- Swine Contracts
- Purchase at least 100,000 head of swine per year and slaughter the swine at a federally inspected swine processing plant at which you:
 - Slaughtered an average of at least 100,000 head of swine per year; or
 - Have the capacity to slaughter at least 100,000 swine per year, based on plant capacity information.

Release of Information / Confidentiality

- Section 222(C) of the Act (7 U.S.C 198 a(c)) addresses confidentiality.
 - "The reporting requirements under subsections (a) and (b) shall be subject to the confidentiality protections provided under section 251 of the Agricultural Marketing Act of 1946 [7 U.S.C. 1636]"
 - (a)CONFIDENTIALITY The <u>Secretary</u> shall make available to the public information, statistics, and documents obtained from, or submitted by, packers, retail entities, and other persons under this subchapter in a manner that ensures that confidentiality is preserved regarding—
 - ▶ (1) the identity of persons, including parties to a contract; and
 - (2) proprietary business information.



Monthly Report Submission

- Monthly Reports provide packers' estimated swine purchases under marketing contracts for the next 6 and 12 months.
- The SCL reports are organized and released by contract type and region. There are three contract types
 - Swine or pork market formula
 - Other Market formula
 - Other purchase arrangement



What existing or available contracts are provided?

- Subject Packers must provide an example of each contract
 - available at each plant that you operate, or
 - available at each plant where you have swine slaughtered.
- Criteria for distinguishing example contracts
 - Base price determination
 - Application of ledger or accrual account
 - Carcass merit premium or discount schedule
 - ▶ Use of non-carcass merit premiums or discounts.



How does information from the SCL help producers?

- Producers use the library to investigate what contract terms packers offer.
- A producer could identify contract provisions of interest.
- A producer could use that knowledge to negotiate what may result in a more favorable contract with a packer.



What the SCL Doesn't Do

- Publish full verbatim contracts, whether redacted or unredacted.
- Other Provisions" are not necessarily verbatim. Rather, any terms or wording that potentially identifies a party to the contract are replaced with more generic terms.
- Publish volume information associated with each contract, price formula, or contract terms.
