 the NOSB votes on proposals. Final votes may be deferred to the last day of the meeting if more deliberation is
 needed.
- NOTE: Agenda items may be withdrawn or votes may be postponed at the discretion of the Board.
- There will be two 15-minute breaks (mid-morning & mid-afternoon) and a 75-minute lunch break mid-day.
